If you would like to attend a weekday service, you must register in advance by calling or emailing the church office. Attendance will be limited to accommodate social distancing and ensure everyone's safety.

We extend a warm welcome to our interim priest, Canon Derek Stapleton, who begins his time with us on March 22nd. We look for to having him as part of our team. We are thankful for his assistance during Rev. Graham's leave.

Even though we will not be worshipping together for Holy Week & Easter, we have planned some virtual offerings of worship and reflection for our Grace Church Family. Here are the upcoming ways to engage with us virtually during Holy Week & Easter:

- ❖ **Palm Sunday** – Worship service will be livestreamed on Facebook at 11AM
- ❖ **Holy Monday** – “Stations of the Cross” video will be shared on our Facebook page & website.
- ❖ **Holy Tuesday** –Morning Prayer service at 11AM (*registration required, contact the office*)
- ❖ **Maundy Thursday** - Morning Prayer service at 11AM (*registration required, contact the office*)
We will also be sharing a reflection video on our Facebook page.
- ❖ **Good Friday** - Worship service will be livestreamed on Facebook at 11AM
- ❖ **Holy Saturday** – An “At-Home Easter Vigil” will be shared on our Facebook page & website. You are invited to read through the service with those in your household or together with friends over the phone or video call. *If you would like a printout of the service, you can pick one up during office hours.*
- ❖ **Easter Sunday** - Worship service will be livestreamed on Facebook at 11AM
